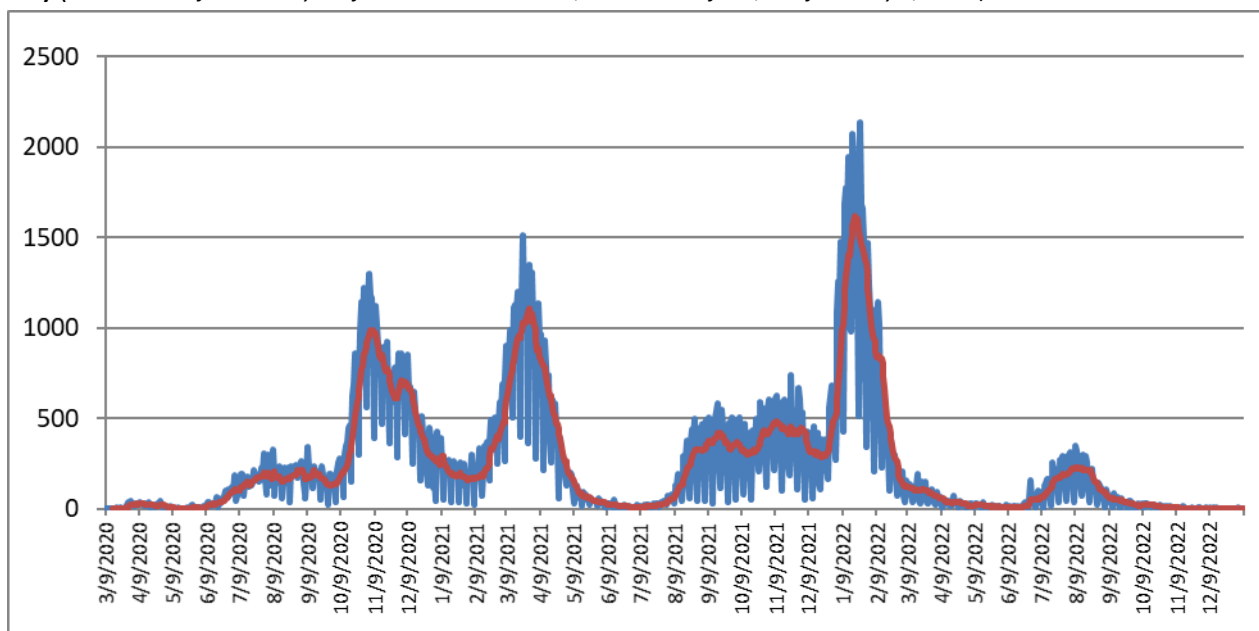

Prema podacima dostavljenim Zavodu za javno zdravstvo FBiH u Federaciji BiH, zaključno s 09.01.2023. u 12h, registrirano je 264 380 laboratorijski potvrđenih slučajeva COVID-19 bolesti i 9 090 smrtnih slučajeva povezanih s COVID-19.

*According to the data submitted to the Institute of Public Health of the FBiH in the Federation of BiH, as of January 9, 2023. at 12 a.m., 264,380 laboratory-confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 9,090 deaths related to COVID-19 were registered.*

Na nivou Federacije BiH, 7-dnevna incidenca iznosi 1,6 slučajeva/100.000 stanovnika. U posljednjih sedam dana, višu incidencu od prosječne zabilježene u Federaciji BiH imaju Posavski kanton i Zeničko-dobojski kanton. Rezultati antigenskih testiranja nisu uključeni u ovaj izvještaj, te stoga ne prikazuje realno stanje epidemiološke situacije. S obzirom na lakšu dostupnost, brže rezultate testa i nižu cijenu testiranja, većina zdravstvenih ustanova se odlučuje na testiranje RAT (brzi antigenski test), iako ZZJZFBiH u svojim preporukama navodi da je u situaciji niske cirkulacije virusa SARS-CoV-2 u zajednici pouzdanost RAT značajno smanjena i preporuča se testiranje PCRom.

U proteklih 7 dana zabilježena su 3 smrtna slučaja.

*In the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina, 7-day incidence is 1,6 cases/100,000 population. In the last seven days, Posavina Canton and Zenica-Doboj Canton, have a higher incidence than average recorded in the Federation of BiH. The results of antigen testing are not included in this report, and therefore do not show the real state of the epidemiological situation. Given the easier availability, faster test results and lower cost of testing, most health care institutions opt for RAT (rapid antigen test), although ZZJZFBiH states in its recommendations that in a situation of low circulation of SARS-CoV-2 virus in the community the reliability of RAT significantly reduced and PCR testing is recommended.*

*3 cases of deaths were reported in last 7 days.*

## **Hospitalizirani**

### *Hospitalizations*

U Federaciji BiH, na bolničkom liječenju trenutno su 33 osobe zbog COVID-19, od kojih su 2 (6,1%) na invazivnoj mehaničkoj ventilaciji. Prema dostavljenim podacima, od 22 hospitalizirane osobe s podatkom o cjepljivosti, 18 (81,8%) je necijepljenih i nepotpuno cijepljenih, a 4 (18,2%) su potpuno cijepljene.

*In FB&H, there are currently 33 people in hospitals due to COVID-19, 2 (6,1%) of whom are in invasive mechanical ventilation. According to the submitted data, out of 22 hospitalized persons with data on vaccinated status, 18 (81,8%) were unvaccinated and incompletely vaccinated, and 4 (18,2%) were fully vaccinated.*
